

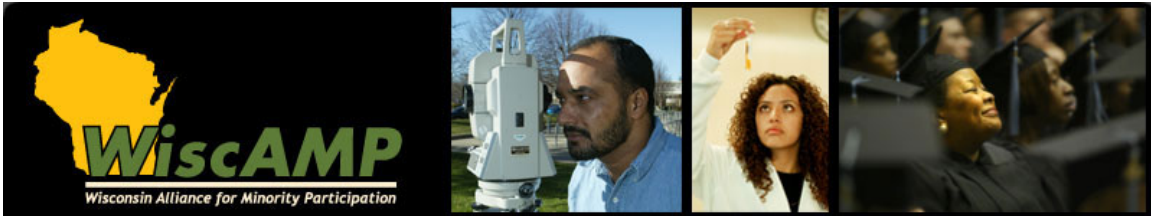
Student Opportunities

- **Summer URE Program in Nanotechnology-University of Massachusetts Amherst**
 - 10 week program with full stipend, housing, and traveling costs included
 - Looking for bright students from diverse background that see themselves going after a Ph.D. in science or engineering in the future.
 - Summer program open to current sophomores, juniors, and non-graduating seniors
 - Participants must be U.S. citizens or permanent residents
 - **Deadline is February 29, 2008**

- **The University of Colorado at Boulder 2008 Summer Multicultural Access to Research Training (SMART) Program**
 - 10 week research internship for undergraduates to prepare for graduate programs in STEM fields.
 - 25 students will participant in research and attend weekly workshops on scientific writing and presenting, GRE preparation and the application process for graduate school
 - All expenses are paid plus a stipend of 3K is awarded
 - **Application Deadline is February 15, 2008**

- **The University of Hawaii at Hilo's Research Experience for Undergraduates (REU) Program is a National Science Foundation (NSF) funded internship program.**
 - Each summer 10 student interns participate in a 4-day orientation and a 10-week research focused internship program focusing on tropical ecology, evolution, and natural resources management.
 - Underrepresented minority students, first generation students, and those with little to no previous research experience are especially encouraged to apply.
 - **To be eligible for the programs, students must be:**
 - Attending a college or university (anywhere in the United States);
 - Pursuing, or intending to pursue, a bachelor's degree in science, agriculture, or Hawaiian studies;
 - Full-time student in good academic standing; and
 - Interested in preserving Hawaii's environment, conservation or Hawaii's natural resources, or teaching science in the future.

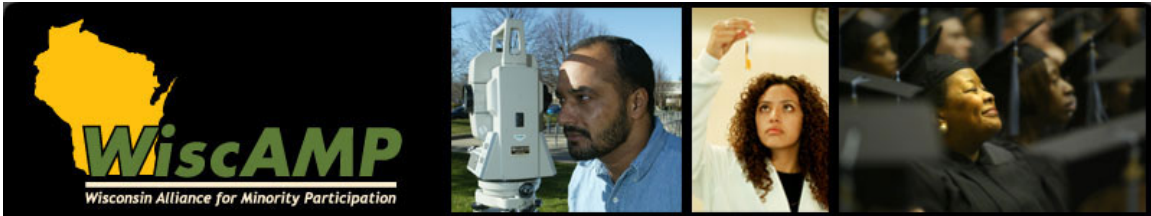

- **CRA-W DMP & CDC DMP (Distributed Mentor Program) 2008 Research Internships**
 - This experience is invaluable for students who are considering graduate school, providing them with a close-up view of what graduate school is really like and also increasing their competitiveness as an applicant for graduate admissions and fellowships.
 - With the CDC DMP, an option exists for the research to take place remotely, using collaborative technologies such that the student can remain at his or her home institution with local and remote mentors.
 - Funding for the student consists of \$600 per week for research, plus relocation travel assistance when appropriate. A student's funding is intended to cover 10 weeks of research in the summer of 2008

- **SOARS 2008 Summer Program**
 - SOARS, Significant Opportunities in Atmospheric Research and Science, is an undergraduate-to-graduate bridge program designed to broaden participation in the atmospheric and related sciences. The program is equal parts research internship, learning community, and mentoring program. SOARS offers comprehensive financial support for summer research and graduate school for up to four years.
 - 10-week summer program typically starts at the end of May and continues through mid-August (The 2008 program will run from May 27-August 8).
